Conditions of Entry

1. Pre-entries will be accepted through online registration via HorseShowsOnline.com. Entry deadline is Wednesday August 25, 2021. Post entries will be charged a late fee of \$30.00 per horse per rider. Please have proof of negative Coggins and signed AHJA waiver. We only accept cash and checks.
 - a. Fees:
 - Class Fee: \$18 each
 - Facility Fee: \$20 per horse
 - Late Entry Fee: \$30 per horse per rider
 - AHJA Non-Member Fee: \$10 per rider
 - AHJA Office Fee: \$10 per horse per rider
 - Paramedic Fee: \$10 per rider
 - Stalls: \$45 (limited) contact Mo Fitts 205-394-0643
2. Hard hats must be worn at all times while mounted, including schooling. All riders must wear ASTM-approved helmets. Appropriate hunt attire required in conjunction with AHJA rulebook.
3. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, cancel any entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit showing of entries and cancel/edit awards of prizes without claims or damages. Management will abide by AHJA rules when combining divisions. Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to weather.
4. NO WARM UP ROUNDS – Schooling breaks are posted in the schedule for each ring.
5. Open schooling will be allowed until 30 minutes prior to each ring's start time. We will water and drag rings before the first class. Schooling will be available Friday August 27th from 1:00 pm -6:00 pm.
6. Lunging – Front outdoor ring
7. ALL dogs must be on a leash at all times.

9. Farrier on call: Charlie Irby 601-692-8104
10. Ten ribbons will be awarded in the walk-trot and cross rail divisions. All other divisions will pin through 6th. Champion and reserve champion ribbons will be awarded only in hunter divisions.
11. Please observe the dotted line in both hunter rings 1 and 2.
12. Show will be held in fenced sand arenas. Schooling ring will be in the covered arena (Ring 3) until the conclusion of Ring 2. Once Ring 2 is finished we will open it as the schooling ring and used the covered for jumpers.
13. Horses will not be excused from showing without a veterinarian's certificate showing illness or incapacity of mount. This must be received by the show secretary by the end of the show.
14. All scratches and adds must be done at the secretary's desk and proof of scratch/add must be taken to the in gate. No adds or scratches at the gate.
15. Full concessions will be provided.
16. This show will run under the guidelines of the current AHJA Rulebook. Please see the AHJA website (alabamahunterjumpers.org) for all class specs and cross entering rules prior to entering. On show day the current AHJA Rulebook will be available at the secretary's desk.
17. Stabling – Stabling must be reserved by contacting Mo Fitts 205-394-0643. Stabling reservations are not accepted via HorseShowOnline.com. Stabling is limited and reserved on first come first served basis. Stalls will be available starting at 2:00pm Friday.

AHJA WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

For and in consideration of the AHJA's acceptance of my entry, and allowing me, the undersigned, or my minor child, to participate in any capacity in an AHJA sanctioned or approved event or activity ("AHJA-sponsored event"), including but not limited to equestrian shows, competitions, clinics, practices and related or incidental activities and events, and Timber Acres, I, for my myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs, executors and administrators, next of kin, successors and assigns, hereby agree as follows:

A. **AHJA RULES AND POLICIES:** I agree to be bound and to abide by the rules and policies of the AHJA as published on its website at www.alabamahunterjumpers.org, and as amended periodically.

B. **ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK:** I knowingly, willingly and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with equestrian sports, and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that any AHJA-sponsored event involves risks and dangers, including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury, sickness and disease, including communicable diseases among humans or animals, trauma, pain and suffering, bites, kicks, abrasions, contusions or other injury or disability, allergic reactions, falls, paralysis, death, loss or damage to personal property, including without limitation to trailers, vehicles, tack, equipment, horses or other animals, and other unknown risks and dangers.

I specifically acknowledge that Alabama and the United States is currently battling the pandemic associated with COVID-19, a highly transmissible infectious disease, and agree that I will comply with any and all safety measures and social distancing protocols instituted by the AHJA and the AHJA-sponsored event, and further agree that I knowingly, willingly and voluntarily acknowledge and assume and take sole responsibility for the risks associated with participating in AHJA-sponsored events during the COVID-19 pandemic and its aftermath.

I HEREBY VOLUNTARILY AND KNOWINGLY ASSUME ANY AND ALL SUCH RISKS AND AGREE THAT I AM SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGES, LIABILITIES, LOSSES, OR EXPENSES THAT I INCUR AS A RESULT OF MY, OR MY MINOR CHILD'S, PARTICIPATION IN ANY AHJASONSORED EVENT. I ALSO AGREE TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY INJURY OR DAMAGE CAUSED BY ME, MY HORSE, MY SPOUSE OR CHILD, AND ANY OTHER PERSON OR ANIMAL ACTING UNDER MY DIRECTION AND CONTROL, AT ANY AHJA EVENT.

C. **WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY:** In consideration of my participation in any AHJA-sponsored event, I hereby release, waive, and agree not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the AHJA, its members, and members of its governing body, and all persons associated with AHJA activities, whether paid or volunteer, including all persons associated with Fox Lake Farm and its farm property, participants (including athletes/riders, coaches trainers, judges and other personnel), owners, guests, licensees, officials, show managers, grooms, employees, promoters, sponsors and advertisers, with respect to any liability claims, demands, causes of action, damages, losses, or expenses, including but not limited to court costs and attorneys' fees, of any kind which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in AHJA-sponsored events, including claims for liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the aforesaid persons.

D. **ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES:** I agree that a facsimile, scanned or other form of my electronic signature on this Agreement is considered to be original and is as legally binding as my handwritten signature.

E. **MERGER AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE:** This Waiver and Release of Liability represents the complete agreement between the parties hereto, and no oral representations, statements or prior agreements have been made apart from the terms specified herein. If any provision of this Waiver and Release of Liability is held to be unlawful, void or unenforceable for any reason, then that provision shall be deemed severable and shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions.

- A. Due to the recent outbreak of COVID-19 the Alabama Hunter Jumper Association will be taking extra precautions for the remainder of the 2021 show season. Anyone choosing to attend an AHJA recognized show is coming at their own risk and by attending you are taking sole responsibility for yourself and anyone under your supervision.

1. To receive admittance to any AHJA sanctioned horse show exhibitors, trainers, grooms, horse show officials, guardians, and essential personnel, etc. must:
 - a. Not have anyone in their household test positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
 - b. Not been advised by any healthcare professional to self-quarantine nor has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
 - c. Not shown any symptoms of COVID-19 in the last 24-48 hours. Symptoms include, but are not limited to, a fever over 100.4, cough, or shortness of breath.
 - d. Must be willing to adhere to all policies implemented by the AHJA and additional policies implemented by the host farm. Any person found not in accordance may be asked to leave or wait in their car by the show managers, show steward, show secretary, or AHJA president.
2. Anyone on property must maintain "social distancing" and keep 6' of space between themselves and others in accordance with federal, state and local guidelines.
3. Any vehicle or trailer is subject to inspection to ensure that only the necessary parties are admitted.
4. NO outside spectators are allowed.
5. Horse Show Office Procedures
 - a. There will be one representative per farm/trainer. This representative will be the only one allowed in the show office per farm/trainer.
 - b. This representative will be responsible for collecting payments (checks or cash) from all clients from the same barn or trainer and turn in payment to the secretaries in exchange for back numbers. Those paying in cash must use the prize list to calculate their total. Cash must be turned in at the beginning of the day.
 - c. Secretaries will email all receipts to the trainers listed on the entry. Trainers are responsible for distributing receipts.
 - d. Only one person will be allowed in the show office at a time.
 - e. Adds and scratches will need to be done online – this will be open until 8:00 pm the night before.
6. Trainers are responsible for making sure their customers and additional personnel adhere to all rules. By coming to the horse show they are taking responsibility of their clients and will be held liable for any action not in accordance with these guidelines. Before entering the show grounds, they need to review the new policies with all persons coming under their supervision.
7. Wearing a facemask is recommended at all times when not mounted, and exhibitors will not be penalized for wearing facemasks during their rounds.
8. When lining up for under saddle/equitation on the flat classes riders need to maintain 6' between themselves and all other competitors
9. You are not permitted to allow social gatherings of 10 or more persons, parties, or in-show events.
10. Show staff will sanitize common spaces throughout the day. These spaces include, but not limited to: port-o-lets, bathroom facilities, door knobs, schooling jumps, wash stalls, community watering spickets, in-gate and ribbon tables, course boards, and any other "high traffic" area.
11. Hand washing or sanitization stations will be available on property. However, it is recommended that attendees bring their own supplies as well.
12. **WARNING:** In this unprecedented time of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Alabama Hunter Jumper Association and Fox Lake Farm are committed to providing the safest and cleanest show facilities and events as reasonably possible, but make no representations or guarantees in that regard.
